These are our class verses for the year in kindergarten! They perfectly reflect what we will learn in kindergarten this year. The first verse is of course the most important as we learn to love God and follow in His steps. The second verse is also very important as the kindergarteners learn to get along and work with others. From sharing our toolboxes to working with a partner, from learning to take turns and raising your hand before speaking, and from being on a team to playing learning games together, they are learning to love their neighbors.

We have had a wonderful start to the school year! The Bible lessons we have covered so far have been on Creation, The Fall, Noah and the Flood, Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac. No better place to start than at the beginning! The kindergarteners have completed a letter recognition unit where they reviewed identifying Aa-Zz. They are now starting to work in their reading books, and everyone is very excited! We also completed an author study on Kevin Henkes for the month of September and have started a new author study on Robert Munsch for October. In math they are learning to identify, write, and explain numbers 0-8. The class has already completed 2 math tests! We began the year learning about what it means to be a scientist which included a fun 5 senses investigation with apples. Now in science we are learning all about plants. In social studies we have looked at how things like toys, clothing, and people change over time. For the final chapter project, the students imagined what they would look like and what they would be doing at age 100. The students each drew a picture and shared their awesome ideas.

The kindergarteners are such hard workers as they continue to work to learn the curriculum and many other new lessons. Every day is a new adventure in kindergarten!
